Network meeting 1

Technology-Enhanced Learning (TEL)

Technology-enhanced learning enables new choices for learners. Flexible learning focuses on giving learners choice in the pace, place and mode of their learning, assisted and promoted through appropriate pedagogical practice, and developed through technology-enhanced learning. Technology can enable new approaches to how learning is delivered and assessed, and can make certain pedagogic approaches viable and scalable. Technology-enhanced learning offers opportunities for personalised learning with the learners finding their own pathway through learning material; and support with various devices and systems so that learners can choose their preferred platform. From an institutional perspective, Technology enhanced learning can offer new opportunities for flexibility in learning and more flexible schemes of study. VET providers and other stakeholders can take the challenge to build an EU community of practice on Technology enhanced learning.

The network meeting will give you insights and ideas on the state of play in different European countries. You will meet experts as your peers on this issue and the possibility to join the EU community of practice on technology enhanced learning.
